Report of Officers

President Betts: (copied and pasted from written report)

As I enter the halfway point of my term as President of the DVFA, I am trying to figure out where the time went. Over the last three months, I have attended 38 functions representing the DVFA, traveling 2,482 miles, and spending approximately 160 hours.

We have been very busy in the winter months with Executive Manager Warren Jones and 1st VP Jay Jones leading the charge to meet all the 15 new members of the legislature. I had the privilege of attending a meeting with the Hockessin legislators (both County and State), and I felt that the meetings were beneficial in letting all the legislators know our needs and what we provide for the citizens of our fire districts. We also had a very successful meeting in February with the Joint Finance Committee, and our requests for adding \$1,000,000,000 to the Revolving Loan Fund, and the \$75,000 to the Fire Prevention Commission for the matching Fire Prevention funds were in the Governor's budget proposals.

Treasurer Terry Whitham and Assistant Treasurer Ray Steve have done a fantastic job in revamping our treasury to make it much more transparent to the membership, and Ray has recently compiled the 2019 Conference budget that was approved by the finance committee. This Committee was chaired by Danny Burris and has done a fabulous job working with the two treasurers.

I would like to ask everyone's support in sending their membership to the CFSI dinner on April 25th in Washington. It is a fund-raiser for the Fire Service Legislative Caucus that supports us by working with the national senators and representatives to lobby for our grant funding, and other issues important to the Fire Service. As the second smallest state in the nation, we have set the bar for attendance since its inception in 1989. Past-President Steve Austin indicated at the December Executive meeting that he would be retiring from the DVFA Foundation effective after the meeting on May 8th, and with Steve's wishes, I would like to appoint Danny Burris of Middletown to take his place on the Foundation. Danny has agreed to accept this appointment. Please check out the President's Handbook on the DVFA website if you are a newer President of a Delaware Fire Company to assist you in getting the needed paperwork in at the correct deadline.

WE have also worked on the handbook for the DVFA Officers to assist them by providing knowledge of the different protocols, meetings, and events that they are supposed to attend, and the times and dates are provided. Finally, once again, I would like to thank all the invitations to my wife and me to all the banquets since the first of December. I am sorry to have missed some due to more than one invitation on the same night but filled in with some of the other officers. I have especially enjoyed the companies that I had not had the chance to visit before this year. Every event was special, and we were treated like royalty.

First Vice President Jones: (copied and pasted from written report)

The second quarter of 2019 has been quite busy to say the least. I attended 42 events and traveled 2390 miles, with 79 hours of service. It has been a pleasure to serve.

The bulk of the time has been getting acquainted and forming relationships with the freshman legislators. During this quarter it has been very positive, as we discuss the funding for the fire service. It seems to be firm and secure. Which allows us to work on other wonderful legislative items such as the much-needed cancer presumption legislation.

Our request made it into the Governor's budget proposal and after going before the Joint Finance Committee, we are looking to get approximately a million dollars added to the Revolving Loan Fund in the bond bill. Plus, the matching funds money for the fire prevention program, through the State Fire Prevention Commission where it belongs in the Governor's Budget. This comes from several meetings with not only the Governor but also legislators to secure these funds.

I have also started to work with fire service leaders in the state of Maryland to make progress on EMT reciprocity.

I would like to thank everyone for the invitation and warm receptions to their banquets and installation of officers programs this year, which I was able to attend.

Looking ahead we have already started working on the Congressional Fire Service Institute Fundraiser in Washington, DC. We, as the Delaware fire service, have the reputation of leading though our attendance at this event. I hope to have great attendance again this year.

The benefit to having such great attendance numbers is that it brings our cost per ticket down. We receive a lot of money each year from federal grants, which are secured by the institute. For many years we have received millions of dollars back into the State of Delaware for the fire service. It is crucial that our numbers are decent. Like last year I am requesting that each fire department send 2 people to this event and if your department has received money directly through these federal grants, I would urge you to send even more.

It is troublesome that we have already had three fire deaths in the first two months of this year. I hope that all departments will ramp up their efforts in the smoke detector drives on the local level. We have plenty of smoke detectors available throughout the state free of charge for our citizens. Some departments have taken a more aggressive approach. They started going door-to-door asking people to check their smoke alarms and even offering to install them for them. I encourage and applaud these efforts. We have plenty of smoke detector DVD's in the storage unit at the fire school. I have them available for anyone that would like to take one for their local program.

Please keep in mind there have been updates to the new revised President's Handbook which is available on our website. We are also looking at the website to eliminate a lot of the empty space and old clutter. We are aware that there is some outdated information on there that we are going to get updated soon.

I will be reappointing the Life Safety Committee and Scholarship Committee for 2020. They have done a great job and I hope they will continue doing excellent things. I challenge them to somehow take it to a new level.

As always thank you for the opportunity to serve you. It is indeed a privilege and a pleasure doing the work of this office.

I attended the joint finance committee hearing and would like to thank the fire marshal for answering the questions that were posed to him which really pertain to the DVFA but he did an outstanding job answering them thank you Grover.

Attended 18 functions, traveled 1,510 miles and was in service for 77 hours. My travel report has been submitted to the Office and will be posted on the web site.

Most of my time this quarter has been spent working on Conference stuff, including working with the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer to develop a budget for the Conference.

Attached is a budget vs. actual expenses to give you an insight on where we stand financially through the end of February.

Also enclosed is an Investment Schedule for our Crawford Financial portfolio. We plan on providing this at very Executive meeting so you can see the status of our investments.

The DVFA credit cards have been switched over to the M&T Bank VISA cards. With the cards being local it will be much easier to manage when we change officers.

Discussion at the Budget & Finance committee meeting on charges we are absorbing to accept credit cards for payment. Between CFSI and the Conference it cost us \$ 2,377.13. It was decided not to accept credit cards in lieu for payment.

President Betts and I met at M&T Bank on Friday, February 22nd. We electronically wired \$2,081,454.02 to the Northern Trust Company for the pension. Thanks to all for your timely submissions. We were 16 days ahead of the deadline.

We had a meeting with Crawford & Associates. I'll let Dan Burris fill you in on the results of the meeting. As always, any questions please feel free to contact either Ray or myself.

Executive Manager Jones: (copied and pasted from written report)

Presumption Legislation: Jay, Ed Klima and I met with Senator Poore and her staff this week on our draft for Presumption Legislation. We are calling this Presumption Legislation instead of Cancer Presumption because we added PTSD. Jay, Ed and I have been meeting for months to hone a draft that was acceptable to us and hopefully to the state as well. After this week's meeting we decided to expand our group to include three more people, one from each county. Brian Reeder is on from New Castle County, Kevin Sipple from Kent County and Steven Deery from Sussex County. When the draft is final we will send it out. When we need help in legislative hall we will be contacting you.

Recruitment and Retention Task Force: This year when we met with the Governor we asked him to help us in Recruiting and Retaining Volunteer Firefighters. Out of that conversation and subsequent conversations has come a joint House and Senate Resolution creating a Recruitment and Retention Task

Force. The resolution is currently in draft form. The Governor's Office sent us their recommendations for the task force we sent them back our suggestions. We have not heard back from them since then. We have already talked to the Speaker of the House and the President Pro-Temp of the Senate and they are on board. How it will work is this way. The resolution will be passed this session. The task force will meet after session and by December 31st will come back with their recommendations. The recommendations or legislation if need be will be worked on next year. Much the same as what happened with the EMS Task Force in 2014. When this draft is done we will send it out.

Safe Harbor: Last Meeting I talked about Safe Harbor. Safe Harbor was a federal bill which the Hospitals misinterpreted to mean they could no longer do one on one exchanges with BLS Units. Since then, and through the help of Senator Carper's Office, they now recognize that they can. We recently received a list of BLS supplies from the State EMS Association. We will start working with each hospital group to set up parameters to try to get these one on one exchanges in place again. More to follow as the information develops.

State Tax Credit: One of the other things we talked to the Governor about was raising our State Tax Credit from \$400 to \$500. I talked to Rep. Carson this week and he is going to work on a bill to do that.

Office Communications: We are working on improving our communications. We are going to start setting up text groups. First for the DVFA Officers, then all the Presidents and Chiefs and more as we see how this works out. This will be much like you presently do with Chief Messaging or whatever text messaging system you use in your own companies.

Thank you, have a great St. Patrick's Day, Easter, Cinco de Mayo, Mother's Day and Memorial Day. And most importantly, let us know if you need anything from the DVFA Office. We will keep you posted on the legislation we just mentioned.

Advisory to State Fire Marshal – Grover Ingle (copied and pasted from written report)

- Fire Fatalities Currently, there are three (3) fire fatalities for 2019. Of those three (3) fire fatalities one (1) had working smoke alarms and three (3) did not have working smoke alarms. The one (1) with the working smoke alarms had other circumstances that prevented the victim from getting out of the structure. All of these incidents still remain under investigation and occurred in Sussex County.
- Deputy Fire Marshal II Michael Pfaffenhauser is out of work on extended medical leave from a job
 related injury. Chief Deputy Fire Marshal Miller along with the Sussex and Kent County Deputies are
 picking up the extra workload.

- Fire Protection Specialist II Desiree McCall was promoted effective January 8, 2019 having met the minimum requirements for promotion to that position.
- Administrative Officer Shelia Alexander has been promoted to this position effective February 18, 2019. As a result the Office Manager position in Kent County is vacant. The vacancy has been posted and currently we are in the process of arranging interviews for the qualified candidates. Position should be filled by April.
- FY 2020 Budget The FY 2020 Joint Finance Committee Budget hearing was on February 11, 2019 and went well. The Capital Bond Bill Hearing is scheduled for April 3, 2019 at 11:30 AM.
- Sprinkler Save Kings Grant Community (News Release Attached) Fenwick Island, February 15, 2019. Bethany Beach Fire Company responded to the location for an odor investigation just after 7:00 AM. On arrival it was determined the sprinkler system had activated extinguishing a fire in the heater room area. The structure was unoccupied at the time of the incident. NFSA included this in their March 8, 2019 weekly news and updates Spotlight on Sprinklers.
- Hardwired Smoke Detector Program Currently on hold due to funding. In 15 years we have installed 2415 detectors in 905 homes statewide at a cost of \$625,264.00.
- DFIRS Reports We continue to work with each Company on their submittals and cleaning up the data.

NEWS RELEASE

February 15, 2019

The Delaware State Fire Marshal's office investigated a structure fire located in the Kings Grant Community. The fire was reported this morning at 07:09 a.m. and was located in the 40000 block of Grant Drive, Fenwick Island, DE.

The Bethany Beach Fire Department responded to the scene for an odor investigation. Upon arrival, it was determined that the sprinkler system had activated and extinguished a fire in the heater room area. The building was unoccupied at the time of the incident, and no one was injured.

A deputy state fire marshal responded to the scene to determine the origin and cause of the fire. The fire originated in the heater room and was caused by a malfunction in the heater system. Damage was estimated at \$1500.00. The Delaware State Fire Marshal's Office credits activation of the sprinkler system to limiting the fire loss of the unoccupied structure.
