

Special Convention of the D.V.F.A. was called to order at 1000 hours by President Edwin Barlow at the Delaware State Fire Service Center, Dover, DE.

Invocation was given by Assistant State Chaplain Walter Lamon.

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was lead by Past President James H. McCall, Jr. (Christiana).

Moved by Harry Warner (Talleyville), seconded by Bill Betts (Frederica) to accept the minutes of previous meeting since they are in printed form - so carried.

ROLL CALL: Roll call showed the following members in attendance: Past Presidents - 16; President Emeritus - 2; Fire Commissioners - 2; Officers - 13; Members - 110; Total in attendance - 143.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Allen Metheny, Treasurer, reported the Treasurer's report was in printed form and available for all concerned. He also recommended that the Board of Directors of DVFA be empowered to research and authorize, if deemed, feasible the acquisition of credit cards for Officers and those appointed to represent this association at Out of state functions, this would eliminate the use of personal credit cards provide for a better accounting for both individual and the DVFA. This will be presented under the proper order of business.

REPORT OF OFFICERS: Officers reports are in printed form and filed with the Secretary.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

ADVISORY TO STATE FIRE MARSHAL: Acting Fire Marshal Daniel Kiley reporting. He reported on the retirement of Ben Roy and other personnel, the effects on the office, in spite of the uncertainty of replacements the Fire Marshal's Office will respond to situations to the best of their ability.

ADVISORY TO STATE FIRE SCHOOL: Lou Amabili reporting. Sussex County Training Center ahead of completion schedule, may have to be manned operationally by October, 1991. New Castle County still looking for a site (Glasgow land is a strong possibility). NVFA is considering our letter on Standards for Volunteers. The Fire School will handle the Memorial Service presentation - Phil Young has been designated by Director to be in charge.

ADVISORY TO MUTUAL RELIEF: Don Ray (Christiana) reporting. Edward Jester (Carlisle) has been appointed to fill James Truitt (So. Bowers) spot from Kent County. The Committee is reviewing some areas for possible By-Laws changes in regards to Mutual Relief.

APPARATUS STANDARDS: Willard Betts (Frederica) reporting. Selbyville new aerial apparatus will be inspected and necessary funds for it will be requested in this year's Grant-In-Aid bill.

ARCHIVES: Robert Romig (Five Points) reporting. All photos of the Past Presidents have been reprinted and when funds are available suitable frames will be obtained and the photos will be mounted near the Fire Commissioner's Office. Suggest that a ribbon with "HALL OF FAME" be made available for those members who have been inducted into the Hall of Fame and it be attached to their convention badge. Following companies have not given a frontpiece to Archives - (New County) Claymont; Delaware City; Elsmere; Goodwill and Talleyville; (Kent County) Leipsic and Marydel; Sussex County is completed.

CIVILIAN RECOGNITION: Kennard Pyle (Odessa) reporting. Committee has 5 non-fire service personnel to be recognized and will get in touch Ray Krett to obtain resolutions for same.

COMMUNICATIONS: Harry Warner (Talleyville) reporting. Medic 41 in Sussex County will be referred to as Medic 101 and will take effect around the end of June.

CONVENTION LIAISON: Francis Dougherty (Brandywine--Hunderd) reporting. Kent County has requested that dates for Convention '92 be approved for Sep 30, Oct 1, 2, 3. Convention '91 agenda was approved. Committee recommends approval for Best Out of State Trophy to be presented by Out of State Coordinators. Committee recommends that the parade for Convention '91 be limited to 3 pieces of apparatus per company (excluding Chief's car and vans).

CRITICAL INCIDENT STRESS MANAGENENT: William Dempsey, Jr. (Cheswold) reporting. Each county has own fund account established - further training will be available. CISM teams are being utilized by the fire service.

FINANCE & AUDIT: George Pyott (Cheswold) reporting. Requests for annual budget for FY92 need to be prepared and forwarded to this committee for consideration and recommendations.

LAW & LEGISLATIVE: John Mitchell (Elsmere) reporting. HB 49 relating to lights and equipment in emergency vehicles has been signed into law by the Governor. 800 MHZ Bond Bill figure will be \$600,000, the Contingency Fund will be written into the Fire Commissioner's Budget and an additional \$14,000 is being requested for fire prevention.

MEMORAIL: Raymond Powell (Millville) reporting. Memorial services will be held on September 20, 1991 at the New Castle Baptist Church in New Castle, DE., the church holds approximately 1,000 persons.

RECRUITMENT & RETENTION: Tony Suppè (Christiana) reporting. Committee working on a Recruitment Program for DVFA and also possible cost of such program.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES: Sophie Dear (Camden-Wyoming) reporting. Information is being gathered and contact has been made with similar positions to the proposed Executive Secretary. Final report will not be available at Convention - still have much research to complete.

REPORT OF ASSOCIATIONS

Joann Sweetman, President of Ladeis Auxillaries, thanked DVFA for their support during the year and offered us any help the Ladies could give us.

Robert Faries, President State Fire Police Association, stated that his quarterly report was in printed form and filed with the Secretary; during the second quarter he attended 46 functions and travelled 1,242 miles.

E. James Monihan (Lewes), NVFA delegate, reflected on his tenure as Chairmen, NVFC and thanked the DVFA for its support during the 12 years. He also presented Certificate to the DVFA from NVFC commending them for 70 years of continuous community services.

Bryan Bennett (Seaford), Chairman State Fire Prevention Commission, thanked President Barlow for the recognizatio.

OLD BUSINESS: A.I. Guessford (Odessa) reported on 501 c (3) project - after much work and research IRS has granted us exemption under 501 c (3) status and the complete file will be turned over to the Secretary for filing. Lobbyist and Legislative Appreciation Night were the main center of attention by the IRS and may need looking into in the future.

Moved by Dean Simpson (Millcreek), seconded by Ray Krett (Goodwill), that the proposed By-Law change to Section 6, as stated, be considered as the second reading and the change be adopted - "A majority of the companies or departments of the Association shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at an Annual Convention or Executive Meeting. All Officers, Past Presidents, and two (2) delegates from each company or department shall be the voting members of this Association, entitled to one (1) vote each on all questions. Should a Past President be a delegate or alternate, or currently serving as an Officer of this Association, this person is only entitled to one (1) vote." - so carried.

George Diamond (Magnolia), 1st Vice President DVFA, presented the following priorities for 1991-92:

1. Maintain Grant-In-Aid funds for all companies, including the leveling up monies for Kent/Sussex Counties at the present funding formula.
2. Increase the Fire Prevention Program funds to a total of \$75,000.
3. Support the 800 MHZ Statewide Communications System.
4. Support the fire burn training center in New Castle County.
5. Funding of Hepatitis inoculation monies.
6. Contingency Fund in amount of \$20,000.

He further stated that the Executive Meetings for 1991-92 would be held at the Fire Service Center on the following dates:

NEW BUSINESS: Hal Barber (Betheny Beach), Chairman Mutual Relief swore in Ed Jester (Carlisle) as Mutual Relief Trustee from Kent County to the fill the vacancy created by the death of James Truitt.

Moved by Hal Barber (Betheny Beach), seconded by John Mitchell (Elsmere), that DVFA support change in Law pertaining to Casino operation - so carried.

Moved by Raymond H. McCall, Jr. (Christiana), seconded by William Himes (Seaford) that J. Benjamin Roy, Jr. be made a President Emeritus of the D.V.F.A. - so carried.

Moved by John Mitchell (Elsmere), seconded by Larry Mergentaler (Mill Creek), to support HB250 (Clean Up Of Hazard Material). Bruce Ennis (Citizens Hose), spoke on the bill and explained the ramifications of it. Vote taken - so carried.

Moved by John Mitchell (Elsmere), seconded by Ed Cline (Hockessin), to support Bill to collect money from apartment complex provided it reads \$10.00 per unit - so carried.

Moved by John Mitchell (Elsmere), seconded by Ray Krett (Goodwill), to support the \$1000 cap on bingo prizes - so carried.

Moved by Francis Dougherty (Brandywine-Hundred), seconded by Charles Honey (Brandywine-Hundred), that the Out-of-State Coordinator's Trophy be approved - so carried.

Moved by Francis Dougherty (Brandywine-Hundred), seconded by Charles Honey (Brandywine-Hundred), Convention '92 dates of Sept 30, Oct 1, 2, 3 be approved - so carried.

Moved by Steve Austin (Aetna), seconded by E. James Monihan (Lewes), to support the Firefighter's Bill of Rights legislation - so carried.

Moved by Willard Betts, Jr. (Frederica), seconded by Ed Cline (Hockessin), that the rescue boat from Lewes and the aerial apparatus from Selbyville be turned over to Law & Legislative Committee and included in this year's Grant-In-Aid Bill - so carried.

Don Ray (Christiana), alluded to Hazard material used to fill flat tires - possible dangerous situation could exist at a car fire or accident.

Moved by George Pyott (Cheswold), second by Robert Sweetman (Aetna), that the Board of Directors be authorized to pursue the possible use of credit cards for the DVFA - so carried.

Moved by Kennard Pyle (Odessa), seconded by Ray Krett (Goodwill), that that the Civilian Recognition Committee be authorized to purchase suitable placques for presentation to 5 non-fire service personnel to be recognized by the DVFA - so carried.

Robert Sweetman (Aetna), Chairman Past President Committee, announced that the committee would meet August 29, 1991 at the Delaware Fire Training Center at 1900 hours. He requested that the President and incoming officers attend this meeting since much of the topics will pertain to them.

Hal Barber (Betheny Beach), expressed the concern to purchase a car for use of the State President. All three counties need to discuss this item and recommend to the State Association.

Moved John Mitchell (Elsmere), seconded by Carlton Dill (Robbins Hose), to work with the State Fire Marshal to have some form of ordinance against faulty alarm systems - several comments made by Steve Austin (Aetna) and Norman Amendt (Millville) - vote taken - so carried.

PAYMENT OF BILLS: Allen Metheny (Hartly), Treasurer, presented bills in the amount of \$121,402.09. Moved by Don Ray (Christiana), seconded by George Pyott (Cheswold), to pay all bills - so carried.


GOOD OF ASSOCIATION: President Barlow presented 50 years of Service Resolutions to Christiana Fire Company and Five Points Fire Company.
